The charity now has more than 500+ volunteers giving up their time to provide a service that



has saved many lives and the NHS thousands of pounds which can now be spent where it is needed most.

SERV celebrated the opening of the charity's new UK headquarters which opened on April 16th in Guildford, Surrey. Welcome to Marie & Elizabeth

SERV OBN have recently purchased two Honda Deauville's bringing the number of bikes in our fleet to five.

Marie & Elizabeth are slightly smaller than our three Pan European's which will enable our smaller riders to ride our dedicated bikes but still big enough for our taller riders.

As is tradition with SERV OBN's fleet, the two Deauville's carry the names of famous medical women.

Marie Curie was a Polish-born French physicist and chemist famous for her work on radioactivity. She was a pioneer in the field of radioactivity and the first person honoured with two Nobel Prizes in physics and chemistry. She was also the first female professor at the University of Paris. Under her direction, the world's first studies were conducted into the treatment of neoplasm's -- including cancers -- using radioactive isotopes.

Elizabeth Garrett Anderson was the first woman to gain a medical qualification in Britain. In 1860 she resolved to study medicine, an almost unheard-of thing for a woman at that time, Dr Garrett worked for over twenty years



at the "New Hospital for Women" and later created the "London School of Medicine for Women".

Marie & Elizabeth made their debut at the OX5RUN when 8 of our volunteers pushed the bikes 5 miles to raise funds for the Oxford Children's Hospital......

applauded and some were even in tears, I even spotted a young girl holding a sign up which read "We Love you Bikers!".

Do SERV have the X-Factor?

On New years day, OBN's John Stepney made an unusual delivery of Factor VIII to Milton Keynes General Hospital.

At the time all we knew was it was needed urgently (as most of our calls are),

We asked Grant Barker who is the team manager for Blood Transfusion and Milton Keynes NHS Trust what is Factor VIII? He told us......

"Factor VIII Concentrate is the treatment of choice for the vast majority of patients diagnosed with Haemophilia 'A'. This is an inher-

ited disorder where patients are unable to produce normal levels of Factor VIII. This is required to maintain the normal clotting of blood.

Reduced or absent Factor VIII levels can lead to acute life threatening bleeding or chronic bleeding into joints that can cause great pain and disability.

Over the New Year Bank Holiday, the fast and efficient action of SERV allowed us to continue to treat two paediatric patients who were at high risk of bleeding. SERV was able to rapidly transport extra Factor VIII from the regional Haemophilia Centre at Oxford to Milton Keynes.

The Factor VIII was used by patients within a couple of hours of contacting SERV. The service that SERV provides is not only fast, but extremely simple to use"




Call Logs
